### Last Chance for Corrections to Parish Directory

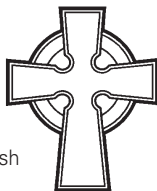

## The Flower Fund

The parish is dependent on the contributions of members to provide floral arrangements for the altars in the sanctuary and the Columbarium. It costs between \$50 and \$75 for flowers purchased for each Sunday. Through the generosity of individuals and families, we receive donations for most weeks of the year, but not all. We would like to encourage our members to remember family members who are celebrating special occasions such as birthdays, graduations, and anniversaries, and to honor those who have died by giving a donation to the flower fund. Just fill out the form in the pew bulletin and attach a check and put it in the collection plate, or drop it by the office, and recognition will be given on the Sunday which you select. Donations to the Flower Fund are tax exempt.



## Coffee Host Responsibilities

There have been a few changes that Sunday Coffee Hosts need to be aware of. The main thing is that we are now using paper cups. This will make it easier since it won't be necessary to load the dishwasher. The other change is that we are no longer using the packets of coffee, but are using filters and must measure the coffee into them. Please use the coffee scoop and measure two scoops per pot. A real money saver!
